Summary of Recent Accomplishments

Emergency Shelters & Transition Houses

Hollyburn expanded transitional housing for youth (8 beds)
Outreach efforts targeting extremely hard to house

Continuum of Support Services

- Integrated Case Management (ICM) better coordination & connections with local services
- Hollyburn/Lionsview Seniors Outreach program
- Shower Program at Recreation Centre (Saturday mornings) – shower, breakfast, support services
- Expanded drop in programs including St. Andrews offering lunch, coffee and connection to supports & North Lonsdale Community Dinner
- Central (one-stop) source for information on affordable housing – CMHA produces & circulates weekly housing list (rentals under \$1000)

Health, Mental Health & Addictions services

- Community Nurse Practitioner providing low threshold services out in the community
- VCH Needle exchange service
- HAW Connect event at JBCC
- Dignity Day at Salvation Army
- Quarterly health connect events at Lookout Housing Centre
- Hospital SWs working closely with ICM coordinator when planning discharge for homeless clients
- VCH Mental Health, chronic disease & MDs also actively involved in ICM

- Continuum of Housing (NSHTF played advocacy role)
 - Anavets –Old building being replaced with new four story building with 76 affordable units for seniors (addition of 18 new units)
 - Need for continuum of housing (including emergency, transitional and social housing) is recognized in both District of North Vancouver and City of North Vancouver Official Community Plans
 - DNV & CNV's have been supportive of the Regional Affordable Housing Strategy, such as providing municipal land, pre-zoning/designating development sites, partnering, reducing fees and processing times for affordable housing projects etc.

Adequate Income and employment training

- North Shore Culinary School at Lookout Chef training - free for people in need (funded by BC Housing). Intake is 8 to 10 students per program and preference is given to NS residents.
- Chef training program at Salvation Army
- Hollyburn employment training initiatives for youth
- Efforts underway to expand opportunities

Challenges

- Very high housing costs, low availability
- No permanent supported housing
- Income assistance/PWD rates not keeping up with housing/living costs
- No dental services, difficult to get family doctor
- Limited access to immediate needs such as food, drinks, blankets, clothing, bathrooms, shower, laundry & personal hygiene
- Limited access to drop-in spaces
- Many homeless individuals are still reporting that they do not feel welcome in most public facilities
- Resources are stretched, struggle with funding

2011 Work Plan Review

- Update work plan
- Update *Housing vulnerable populations* report (inventory of local emergency/social housing & resources)
- Survey to determine priorities
- Set goals for next 3 years

Priorities for 2012-2015

- **1. Increase transitional housing programs** (including various vulnerable populations)
- 2. Rehab Support Recovery Facility
- **3. Expand employment** programs/employment training programs
- 4. Improve communications and increase political engagement (Communications)
- 5. Create targeted services for the chronically street entrenches and extremely hard to house

Looking ahead

- We have formed sub-committees to address each priority area
- Five priority areas are regular NSHTF agenda items
- We are developing a communications strategy that includes media, political engagement, business engagement and educating the public
- We will work with student interns to gather local statistics of housing resources and service use
- We are working towards more regular connect events, but also engaging dentists, optometrists and other health professionals to provide in-kind services to homeless population
