The Burnaby Task Force On Homelessness was established in January 2005 and leads local initiatives to END homelessness in Burnaby.

The Burnaby Task Force On Homelessness is comprised of representatives from

- government agencies,
- the health authority,
- community organizations,
- businesses,
- faith communities and
- concerned citizens

who have come together to identify and address issues of homelessness in the City of Burnaby.

The primary areas of focus are:

- Community Awareness and Provision of Services
- Extreme Weather Shelter
- Developing Housing Solutions To Homelessness
- Developing Community Partnerships
- Improving Income for People with the Issue of Homelessness or At Risk of Homelessness



In 2006 the Burnaby Task Force on Homelessness supported the opening of an Extreme Weather Response.


It is operated by Lookout Emergency Aid Society.

The Extreme Weather Shelter is opened on a weather dependent basis between October and April when the weather is deemed too unsafe for people to be outside.

Extreme Weather Shelter

Burnaby's Extreme Weather Shelter is located at Westminster Bible Chapel 7540 6th St Burnaby

Hours of operation are: 7:00 pm until 7:00 am People will be offered food and a safe warm dry place



to sleep and referrals to needed services.

Progressive Housing Society's Homeless Outreach Program with support from the Burnaby Task Force on Homelessness opened an **Outreach Resource Centre** in November 2006. This centre provides weekly access to outreach workers, food, clothing, medical care, a 'learning table' monthly and flu shots seasonally.









Progressive Housing Society's Homeless Outreach Program expanded in 2008 to include Mobile Outreach services that are available in all areas of Burnaby.

This program provides food, clothing, comfort kits, and outreach worker support to conduct housing searches, advocacy, assistance with obtaining ID for a few examples.

Homeless Outreach Program



The Progressive Housing Society's Outreach Workers have assisted over 401 people to find housing since October 2006.

The Outreach Resource Centre has served over **19,600** meals and sees an average of **100 – 120** people per week.

Recent Successes Since 2010

- March 2011:
 - Burnaby Community Connections contracted to be **Host Agency** for the Task Force
- Task Force enabled to:
 - apply for the HAW grant
 - receive financial contributions from corporate & political donors



Recent Successes continued....

- Vancity grant provided funds to hire Event Coordinator in 2011 (11 weeks 90 hours)
- Vancouver Foundation grant provided funds to hire a Community Development Coordinator (1 year 40 hours per month)

- Positive partnership with Burnaby Board of Trade
- Regular meetings with City of Burnaby
- Meetings with Constituency Assistants across parties from all four MLA's and 2 MP's and City Councillor to pursue ways to effectively work with senior levels of government


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5) Safe City Micro Cleaning
