The society provides communities in the lower mainland with programs and services for immigrants and new comers. DIVERSEcity provides counselling, outreach and employment services through these departments:

DIVEREcity has also established a well-regarded Food Security Program that helps low-income immigrant and refugee families by holding cooking groups and facilitating community gardens. Through the Community Garden project, participants gain valuable experience in climate appropriate produce, organics, composting, seed saving, as well as harvesting. Individuals work collectively, form new relationships and build self reliance.

The Community Kitchens Program, stablished in 7 locations within Surrey helps participants learn how to budget, cook healthy Canadian recipes, food preserving, and receive food safe training.
