Do you know a Homeless Veteran?

Question: Have you served in the Canadian Forces or with the RCMP? (It is more common for individuals to self-exclude themselves as a Veteran as they may feel the definition is different than their own)

If ${\it YES}$ they may be eligible for services through Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) listed below.

ALL VETERANS:

• Case management

VETERANS MAY qualify for:

 Support to families, Veterans Independence Program, Health treatment benefits, Mental health supports, Long-term care, and disability benefits.

Specific services for:

- Traditional Veterans, or those who served in the First World War, the Second World War or the Korean War.
 - War Veterans Allowance (WVA): VAC provides a regular monthly payment to lowincome clients who meet certain requirements.
- Modern- Day Veterans, or those members and former members of the Canadian Forces
 (including those who served in special duty areas). Civilians who are entitled to benefits because
 of their wartime service. Survivors and family members of military personnel. Former members
 of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP).
 - Financial benefits: VAC provides financial support to modern-day Veterans who have a service-related rehabilitation need or career-ending condition.
 - Group health insurance: VAC provides group health insurance at an affordable cost to modern-day Veterans who would not otherwise qualify.
 - Rehabilitation: Our rehabilitation program can help modern-day Veterans who need help to re-enter civilian life. This may include medical, psychological and vocational services.
 - Career Transition Services: VAC provides help in planning and making a successful transition from the Canadian Forces to civilian employment.
