# HOMELESSNESS IN METRO VANCOUVER: A FOCUS ON SENIORS (55+YEARS) 

March 8th 2017

## ABOUT

A point-in-time homeless count took place in Metro Vancouver on March 8th 2017. A total of 3,605 individuals were found to be experiencing homelessness.

This graphic highlights seniors who were 55 years and older, representing $21 \%$ of those who responded to the age question or 518 individuals.

NOTE: Not every person who was counted participated in the survey, as such, the number of responses varies between questions. *Due to rounding, some percentages may not add up exactly.

43\% of seniors received OAS/GIS/ CPP or another pension compared to 11\% of all respondents
